Dear Friends,

As I write this letter, the nation is in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. As I think back on the college's last year (fiscal year 2020), the impact of the pandemic on the college dominates my thinking. Simply put, the pandemic has made a dramatic impact upon each and every aspect of life at our beloved college.

I look back on March 13, 2020 as the pivotal date in the last year. It was spring break. As I looked out my office window over the center of the Swainsboro campus, there were fewer students than usual due to spring break but I could see conversations taking place in the quad as usual; I had the opportunity that day to stop and talk with a few students in the rotunda of the Luck Flanders Gambrell Building; and I was looking forward to having students over to our home several times later in the semester for dinner and conversation. Life at the college changed dramatically that day as it changed in every other aspect of life in our country.

For example, our budget has changed dramatically. As state revenues decreased due to the pandemic, all state institutions of higher education were directed to significantly reduce budgets for the current fiscal year (fiscal year 2021). The format of our classes changes dramatically. On March 13, 2020, we switched to a 100% online format. Now our classes are, for the most part, a combination of face to face and on-line instruction for health and safety reasons. The list of fundamental changes at the college goes on and on.

The positive response of the college community to these changes has been amazing. Faculty and staff adapted to the new learning format with incredible speed and hard work and a "can do" attitude. Students adapted rapidly to learning in a different manner. Friends of the college responded with donations to help us buy protective face coverings and meet other unanticipated needs. All adapted positively and cooperatively to the new world of social distancing, protective face coverings and constant handwashing and disinfectant use.

This willingness and capability to change gives me optimism about the future of the college. All institutions of higher education face even more fundamental changes in the coming years due to the pandemic. Only those willing to adapt will thrive. In the long run, EGSC will thrive.

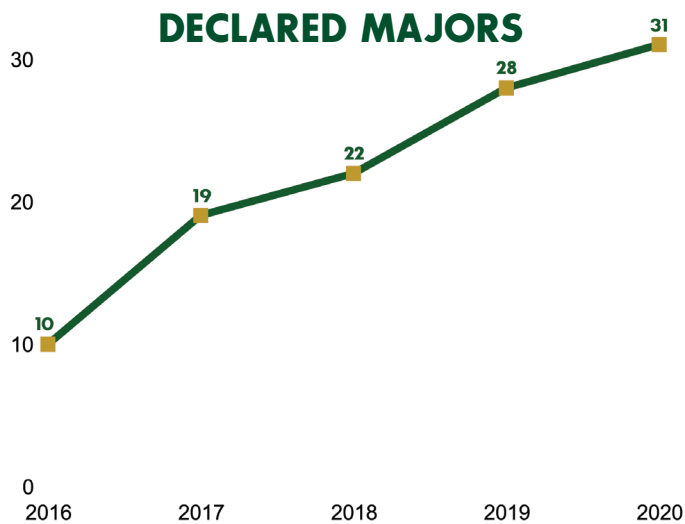

AFRICAN-AMERICAN MALE INITIATIVE

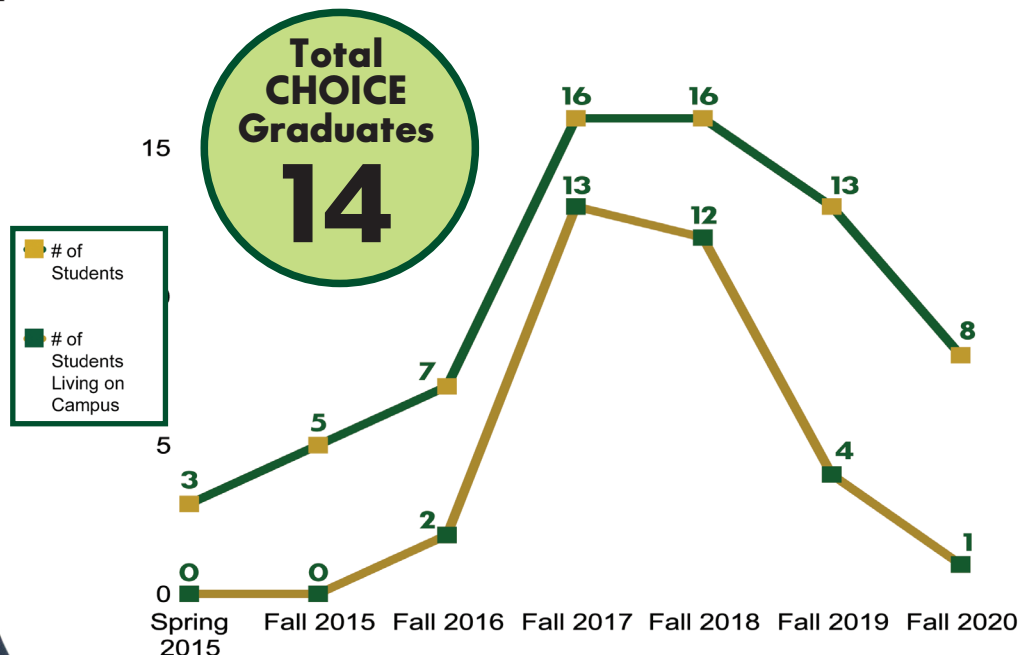
The goal of EGSC's participation in the USG's AAMI is to improve persistence and completion rates among African-American males through four key program elements: 1.) academic skills enrichment, 2.) student support services, 3.) adult/peer mentoring and engagement with successful role models, and 4.) leadership development, which are provided over a one-year period or longer. About 100 college students were enrolled in the AAMI study during the fall 2017, fall 2018 and fall 2019 semesters, with follow-up continuing until 2020.



CHOICE PROGRAM

CREATING HIGHER EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES TO INCREASE COLLEGE EXPERIENCES

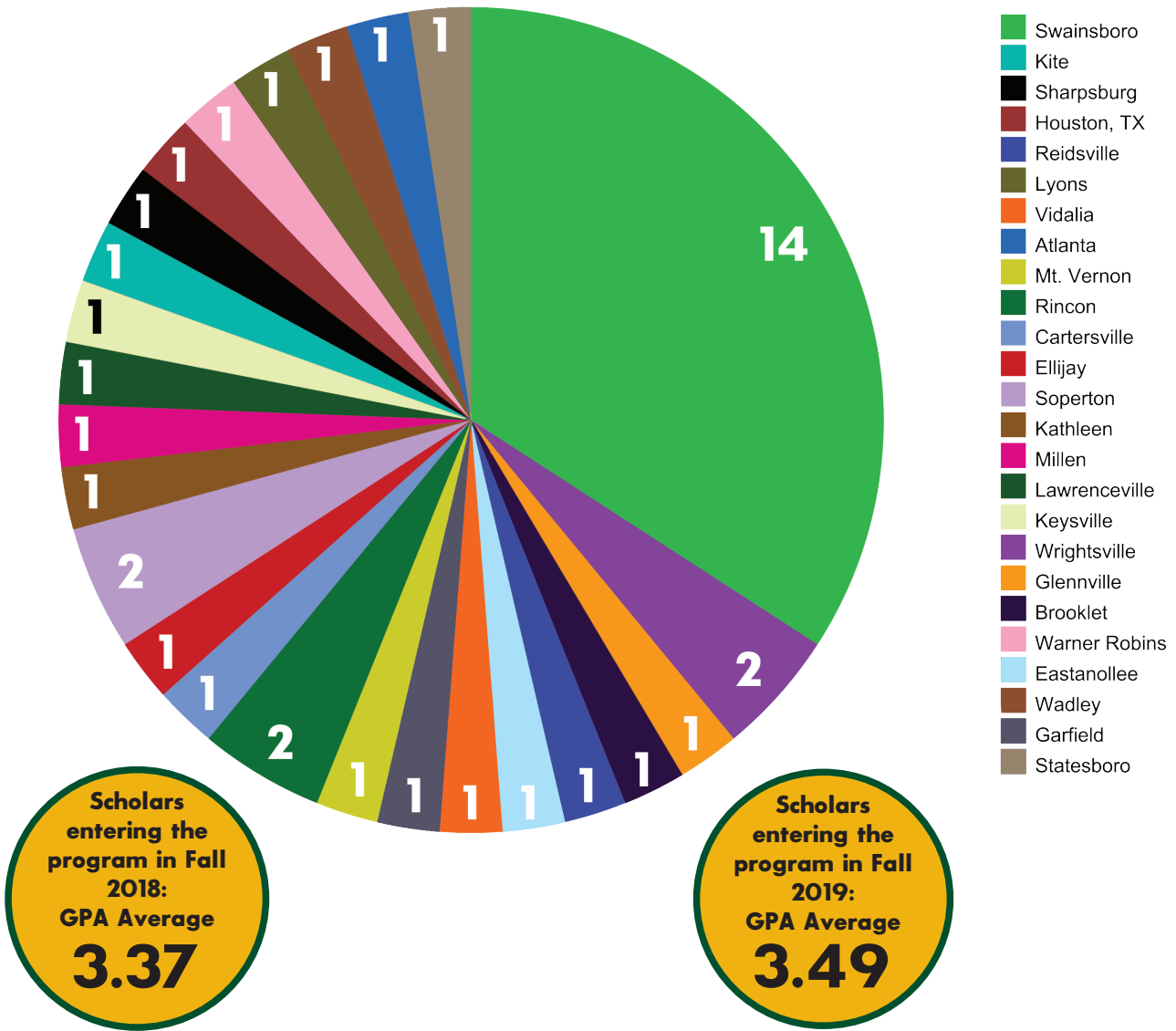
CHOICE is a two year non-degree college inclusion program at East Georgia State College designed to provide students, who may traditionally be excluded from post-secondary education, the opportunity to participate in college classes and develop work-readiness employment skills. Students with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities may qualify for this program. Upon completion of this program, students earn a Certificate of Accomplishment in Work Readiness Skills.



CORRELL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The Correll Scholars Program was established in 2014 and began Fall semester 2015 to recognize and prepare exceptionally promising students as future community leaders in our region. Awards are \$5,000 per student, renewable annually, for a maximum of four years. Twenty scholarships are awarded each year to students attending EGSC's Swainsboro campus.

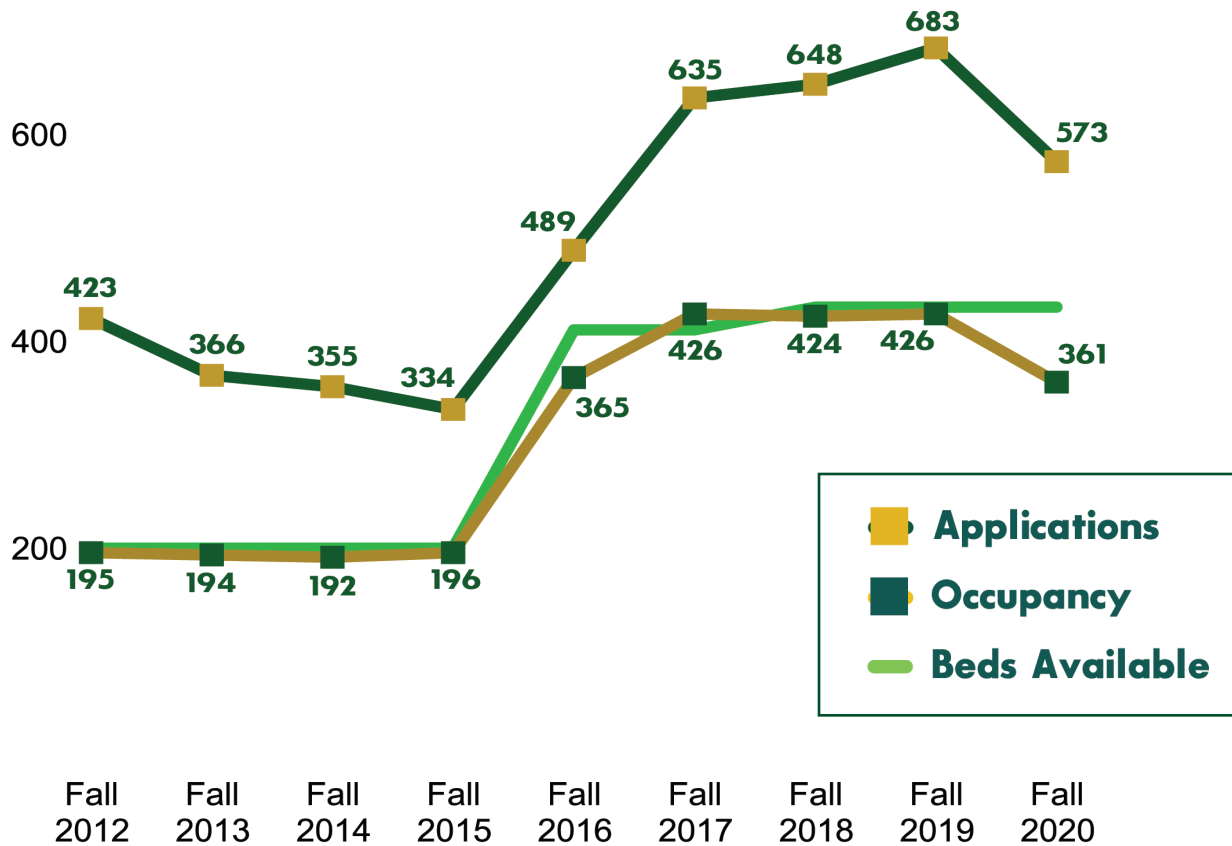
BOBCAT BUDDIES MENTORING PROGRAM

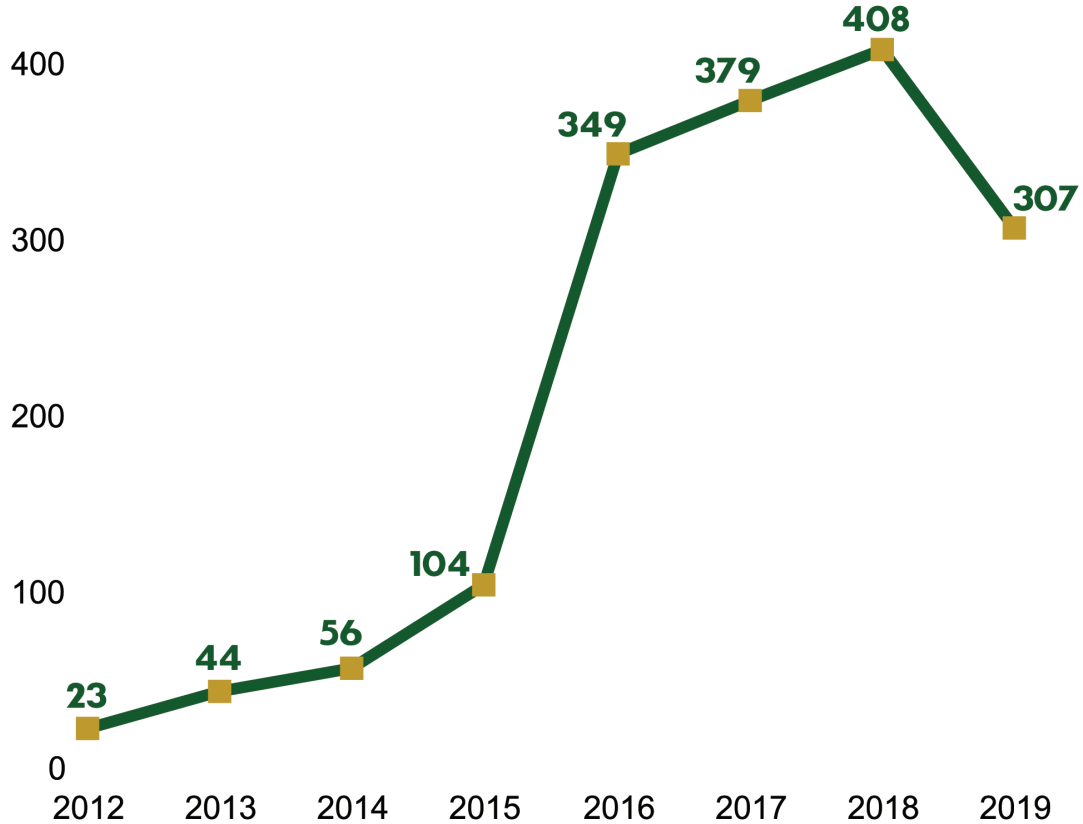

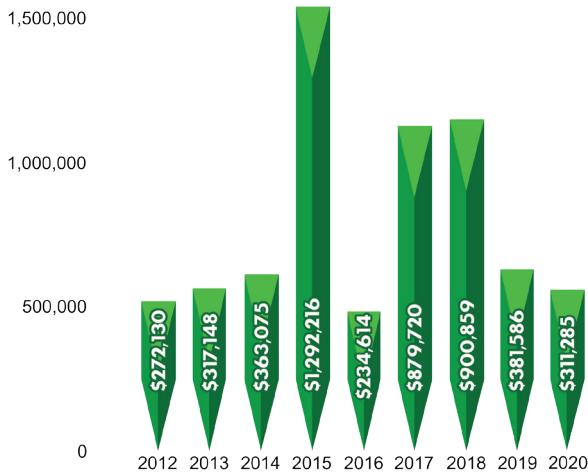

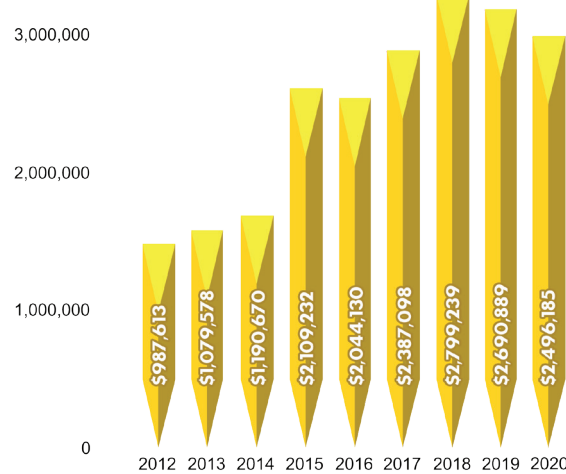
