

## ANNUAL SHERMAN'S MARCH TOUR SET FOR FEBRUARY 29

Join Dr. John Derden, Professor Emeritus of History at East Georgia State College, for a day tour through Emanuel, Jenkins, and Burke Counties retracing the route of Sherman's soldiers as they moved through the area on their way to the coast. Participants will travel some of the actual roads traversed by Sherman's soldiers and defended by Confederate troops, see several camp sites actually used by the general, and visit Antebellum plantation sites.

In addition, Dr. Derden, who has published the first full-length, documented history of Camp Lawton (*The World's Largest Prison: The Story of Camp Lawton* [Mercer University Press, 2012]), will lead a tour of Camp Lawton, the Confederate prison located on the grounds of what is

now Magnolia Springs State Park, and give an illustrated talk about its history.

Participants will gather at 9:00 a.m. for a pre-trip orientation at the Fulford Center. Lunch and transportation will be provided for the day, and the tour will return to the Center by 6 p.m.

Sponsored by the Office of Institutional Advancement at East Georgia State College, the tour fee (which includes all expenses) is \$80 per person. EGSC students are \$10 per person. Registration deadline is February 19.
