Removal of Pre-Requisite for FESA 2105 Building Construction for Fire Prevention

Purpose

The purpose of this policy change request is to remove the prerequisite that exists for FESA 2105 Building Construction for Fire Protection.

Discussion

The curriculum for the Associate of Arts in Fire and Emergency Services Administration is designed from the model curriculum adopted by the Fire and Emergency Services Higher Education (FESHE) initiative at the National Fire Academy. While FESHE does not certify or accredit institutions that teach their curriculum, they do recognize institutions as being a FESHE college or university. This recognition is highly regarded by fire and emergency services organizations and potential students.

For some reason, the FESHE model curriculum recommended Principles of Emergency Services (FESA 2101) as a pre-requisite for FESA 2105 Building Construction for Fire Protection. None of the other classes have pre-requisites. When the AA-FESA program was developed, we were concerned that if we did not conform to the model curriculum, and thus the prerequisite requirement, we might not receive FESHE recognition for the Associate degree program.

Since the creation of the AA program, I have allowed students to take FESA 2105 Building Construction without having the prerequisite FESA 2101 and have not noticed any difference in their success in the class. It is my opinion that this prerequisite is not needed for this class.

It is my recommendation that this pre-requisite be removed for FESA 2105

Building Construction for Fire Protection. There is no additional review process by

FESHE or any need for a "re-recognition" for our program by the FESHE initiative, so this change will not affect this recognition.
