 - ➤ Type at least 1 paragraph, but <u>no more than 2</u> with your <u>name</u>, <u>due</u> <u>date</u> and <u>primary color at the top right corner of page</u>. Use complete sentences and 12 pt. font. **DO NOT** include your primary color in your paragraph writing.
 - Share 1 personal characteristics that you LIKE about being your primary color and why, then give 1 personal characteristics that you would like to change about yourself that reflects your primary color and why. Lastly, give an example of how you plan to implement that change.

I like being organized because it helps me keep track of my hectic schedule and I can get things done quickly and effectively. I would like to have more "fun", but truly, there is no time. I know that sounds crazy, but I have many responsibilities that require me to be focused and thorough. I have many people that depend on me.
