I. Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to guide and direct the working relationship of the parties during the planning, delivery and evaluation of a cooperative academic program ("The Program") as more fully described herein.

II. Background

A. Complementary Missions of the Two Institutions

- Georgia Regents University (GRU) located in Augusta, Georgia is a comprehensive research university, providing a full range of medical and health care programs, and will offer degrees through the doctoral level.
- East Georgia State College (EGSC) is a USG institution with an access mission and locations in both Swainsboro and Statesboro. In addition to offering a broad range of associate degrees, EGSC now offers a bachelor's degree in biology. A key element of EGSC's current mission is to successfully prepare students for transfer to other USG institutions. More specifically, EGSC has for many years offered courses at its location in Statesboro specifically designed to prepare students for transfer to Georgia Southern University in Statesboro.

GRU and EGSC agree to carry out the above cooperative program according to the terms outlined above.




EGSC Augusta's Enrollment Growth Since Initiation of the Collaboration with GRU


